## Academicus and the desperate need of a Human Conscience

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15 years ago, Franco Ferrarotti¹ in the preface he wrote for the first issue of Academicus ISJ², underlined the courage of the founders to publish in print a scientific journal in the era of online communications, where everything was being more and more transformed from any tangible form, even the most desperate ones, into 1s and 0s, sailoring into ether.

Thoughts, feelings and dreams, most of all created from a tangible entity, man, capable to develop and produce intangible items – ideas and reasoning- due to something possessed and that differentiated it from other entities – consciousness.

Academicus challenged the concept of the "privilege of some"<sup>3</sup>, gained by the conformity with cliches and any validation system, converted into status and access, that created a rigid stratification very hard to surpass from "new entries", people and nations, not labeled as source of excellence.

By welcoming researchers, authors and works with distinctive novelty and scientific pursue, the journal tried to bring also glimpses of something rare in the today's research methodology, abductive reasoning, even if it is of a probable scientific influence, but very important, as it is the product of a conscious mind enhanced by experience.

Semi-annual, holding a very selective process that came out with 400 articles published in 30 Issues, and a unique global geography of topics and authors, 390 of them, Academicus gathered and placed side by side the scientific product of highly globally recognized experts of the research fields that the journal covers, with fresh and vital thought, elaborated following valid scientific tools, but with a high level of conscience on evolving and survival.
